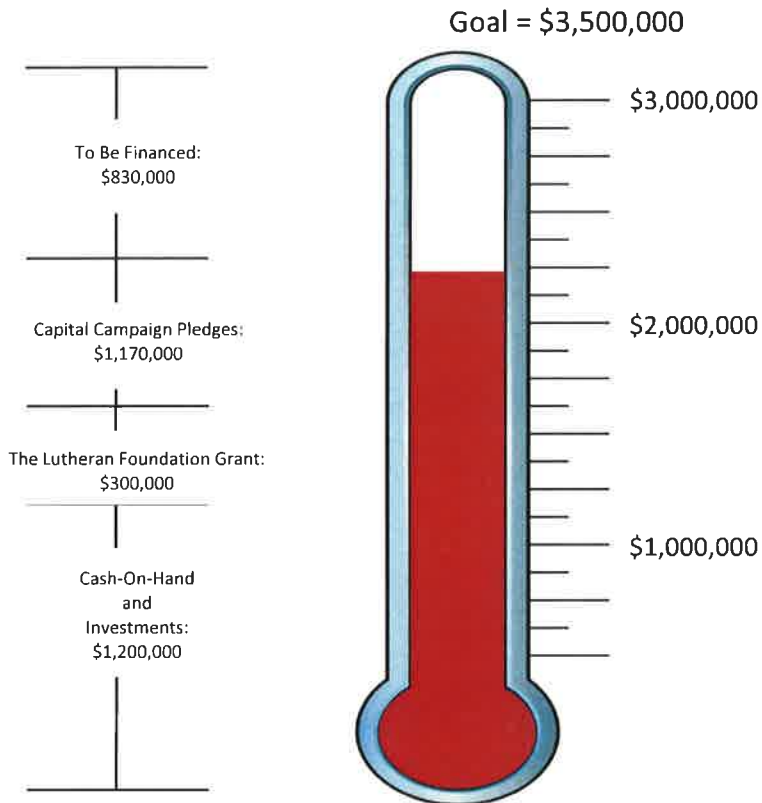

Building Project Thermometer Information

Updated 3/21/24



Breakdown of Funds Received (63.4% Complete):

- \$1,200,000 from Congregation (100% complete)
- \$ 300,000 from The Lutheran Foundation (100% complete)
- \$ 606,843 from Pledges (52% complete)
- \$ 114,112 non-Pledged/over and beyond pledge amt to reduce financing
- \$ 715,888 needed for financing

Construction is taking shape!

Workers took advantage of some of the warm weather in March to prep the ground for concrete. The concrete has now been poured for the new classrooms and office suite. Steel has also been delivered for framing.

The Wee Creations parking lot on the north side is now officially closed as construction progresses.

Grant Matching Information

Dear friends in Christ,

Greetings in the name of our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! Christ is risen—alleluia!

We have been diligently working towards enhancing our facilities to better serve the needs of our active congregation and its ministries. Hopefully you have seen first-hand the quick progress that has been made over the past three months. In this building campaign, our hope is to extend our reach to the wider community and region. This vision has been nurtured by our collective dedication to our mission to be “Friendly People, Growing in Christ – Called to: Praise and Proclaim, Learn and Love, Care and Celebrate” in Fremont, Angola, and Coldwater, and the entire tri-state area!

Today, I am filled with gratitude as I extend an invitation to you to participate in a remarkable opportunity that has been presented to us. Two families have given Peace a \$400,000 matching grant for our building campaign’s future mortgage debt reduction. This means that every dollar we raise will be matched dollar for dollar, effectively doubling the impact of our contributions!

However, it is important to note that this matching grant is contingent upon our ability to raise new funds by the end of the year. ‘New funds’ are monies that have *not already been pledged or committed in the first campaign two years ago.*

This is where each and every one of us has the opportunity to make a significant difference! So please pray for this opportunity and pray about your participation in it. St. Paul give us direction: “Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. Family Promise could Use More Helpful Hands

I'm excited to share opportunity to extend hands of love to those in need with in our community! Family Promise (63 West Washington St, Coldwater, MI) has finished updates to it's shelter home. All windows have been replaced, the kitchen and bath both remodeled, and an additional 2 (main floor accessible) bedrooms (500 sq feet) will double the capacity from 8 to a potential 16 guests being served. Family Promise provides temporary shelter, meals, and support services to families experiencing homelessness! With their recent improvements, we, here at Peace have the opportunity to make a greater impact in the lives of those facing difficult circumstances!

Thus, I'm reaching out to you, cherished Peace family! By volunteering for Family Promise, you can make a tangible difference in the lives of families in need. Whether it's preparing meals, delivering meals, purchasing food items, providing financially, or praying for all, your time and energy are invaluable! Many of the same people have been volunteering for the past 10 years.

What a blessing that has been! Now with the growth, we could use even more!

So what's involved? We currently plan, make, and deliver evening meals for 1 week every 2 months! Upcoming, our weeks involve May 20-24, July 15-19, September 16-20, and November 18-22.

Since we serve meals only 4 times/week, that is equal to only 16 meals which might include the some of the following:

An entree-

Casserole, Swiss Steak, chicken, chili, tacos, etc.

A side-

some sort of potato, rice, pasta

A vegetable or salad

A dessert-

brownies, cookies, cake,
cheesecake, pie

LUTHERAN SENIOR CARE MINISTRY Celebrates 100 Years

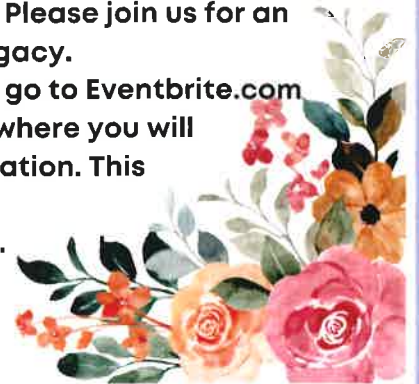

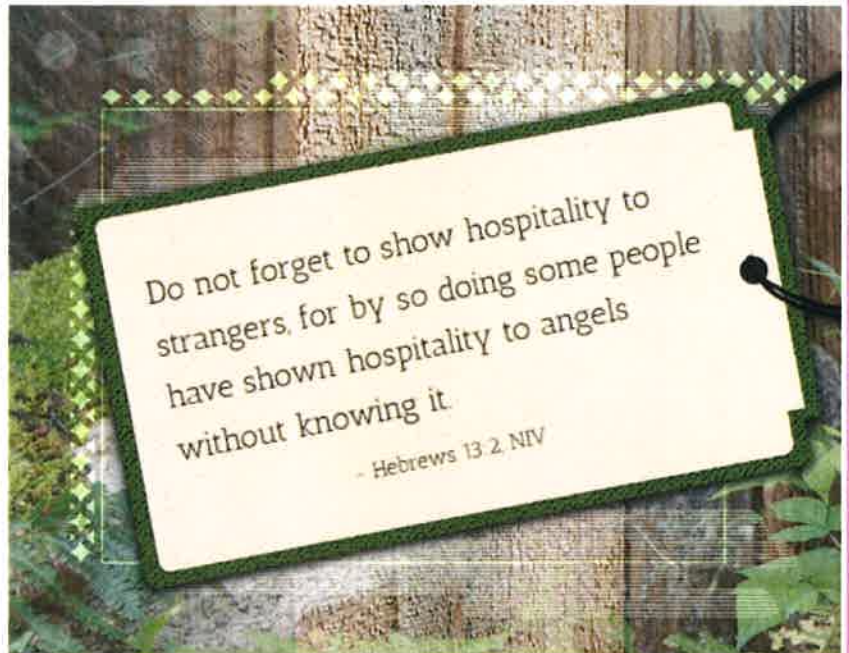

"HOW DOES YOUR GARDEN GROW?"

As I write this and look into the sky the sun is shining brightly and there is hope that spring is coming soon. Today found me potting up caladium bulbs and dahlia tubers in anticipation of those magnificent summer colors. Yes, they have to start growing indoors but at least they are in the soil. I have no idea what is in store for us for the coming month but it could be crazy as the "winter that wasn't." Regardless, all of us who are intrigued by the the soil and growing plants are certainly ready. There are no better optimists than gardeners. When your hands get dirty in the soil, you just have to grow closer to your Creator.

And so we begin the twelfth year of "Garden of Peace: The Growing Place." Again, the first portion of the name identifies who and what we are and the second why we exist, as we grow both physically and spiritually. This is a unique ministry of Peace Lutheran to help church and community members to experience the joy of gardening and to share the fruits of the harvest with others. Our motto this year is "Grow a Row for Those in Need."

And so it is time once again to sign up for a plot. While there is no fee or cost involved, please note: if you request a plot, it is necessary that you make the commitment to maintain the assigned garden area throughout the entire growing season. Priority in assignments will be given to gardeners who have had plots in prior years as they have worked to develop a particular area.

From what I understand there are a few people who had plots last year who will not be able to continue this year and so there will probably be several plots available to "newcomers" to the Peace Garden. We already have two "newbies" who have signed up, but there may still be room. What we need now is a list of all those who wish to have a garden plot for the season. Each plot is approximately 10' by 18'.

If you wish to reserve an area, you need to sign up in one of two ways:

- 1) Use the sign-up sheet that is available at the Information Desk
- 2) contact Garden Mentor Don Luepke via email at donluepke@juno.com and give your name, e-mail address, and telephone number.

If you were a gardener last year, indicate if you wish the same plot.

We ask that this be done by Sunday, April 7, so that we can develop our organizational plan.

We also want to be able to reach out to members of the lakes community and perhaps mentor them in establishing a garden and producing food and flowers for their homes. If you know of someone outside of our church family please let them know. It's a matter of mission and ministry. After all we are Peace Lutheran Church: "Friendly People – Growing in Christ, Called to Praise and Proclaim, Learn and Love, Care and Celebrate!"

As always, let's get growing!
