### A letter from Pastor Teeple

Dear friends in Christ,

As the days grow shorter and the air turns crisp, we find ourselves at the threshold of one of the most sacred seasons of the year: Advent. This season is a time of preparation and anticipation as we journey toward the celebration of Christ's birth. It is a season that reminds us of God's promises fulfilled in Jesus, Emmanuel, God with us.

Advent also invites us to reflect on what it means to be a family made holy through faith in Christ Jesus. We will see that in our Advent Devotionals, which have been prepared by members of our congregational community. As we close out one year and step into the next, we will gather for a time of reflection and commitment. This service will be an opportunity to thank God for His faithfulness in the past year and to seek His guidance for the year ahead.

These moments are more than traditions; they are opportunities to align our hearts with God's purposes. Together, as we sing, pray, and serve, we are reminded that Christ is not just at the center of our church but also the center of our lives.

Thank you for the many ways you contribute to our vibrant community! Whether through volunteering, worship participation, or acts of kindness, you embody the love of Christ. My prayer this season is that we all experience the joy of being part of God's holy family—a family that celebrates His gift of salvation and shares His light with the world.

### A letter from Pastor Rudolph

Anticipation is high in the Rudolph household. Now that the temperatures outside have dropped and snow becomes more likely, Christmas seems to be right around the corner. Music, events, decorations, and planning are all oriented toward Christmas once again. One thing I'm particularly excited for, and anticipating greatly, is the Wee Creations Christmas Program! What a great witness our Wee Creations kids will give to all the parents, community members, and church members who will come and rejoice with us! This program is also a great witness to the great work Wee Creations does all year long. So I wait with great anticipation to hear the kids praise the Lord!

The nature of anticipation, though, is that we have to wait for the event to come. Time must pass as we press toward the goal. But this anticipation, excitedly waiting for something to come, is what the Advent season brings to the Church Year. Over the next few weeks, we wait for Christ to come to us liturgically just as the Old Testament Christians waited for Him to come physically. For thousands of years, the promise of the coming Savior was passed down from Adam and Eve to the New Testament Christians who witnessed Christ's birth, life, death, and resurrection. God proclaimed the Gospel to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel" (Genesis 3:15). Adam and Eve did have sons, but they did not accomplish this promise. Cain did not bruise the serpent's head, instead he bruised his own brother's head. So the Church waits with great anticipation for the greater "offspring" to come.

God then proclaimed this same Gospel to Abraham later, saying, "I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you and him who dishonors you I will curse., and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed...to your offspring I will give this land." (Genesis 12:2-3, 7). But as the Church meets Abraham's offspring, it's clear that they will not accomplish what was promised to Adam and Eve, for "God will provide for Himself the lamb for a burnt offering" (Genesis 22:8). So the Church will wait with even greater anticipation for the greater "offspring" to finally come. And we, the entire Church with great anticipation, waited, and waited, and waited. Moses came, but the Church had to wait for a greater prophet like Moses to come. David and Solomon came, but the Church had to wait for a greater Son of David, for God promised David that He would "raise up your offspring after you, who shall come from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build a house for my name and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son" (1 Samuel 7:12-13).

And in a few weeks, we will see this Son be born who will set His face toward Jerusalem where He, the Lamb of God, will be a blessing to the nations, for it was on the cross that Christ's heel was bruised as He crushed the serpent's head. After nine months in the womb, just like any other baby, Jesus was born on Christmas so that He could establish His Kingdom with us. The Son of God, begotten of the Father from eternity, has saved us by His grace through Christmas. So we wait with great anticipation to celebrate this great Gospel message once again!


