A Letter from Pastor Teeple

A Letter from Pastor Rudolph

A blessed Epiphany season to you all!

For the past few weeks, and continuing on through February, we have been talking through the Seven Mission Priorities of our national church body, the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. As we began this study a few weeks ago, we heard that God did not keep silent when we needed Him: For Zion's sake, I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch (Isaiah 62:1). Following God's care for us, we will speak up for the sake of our families and neighbors, so they too will share in the salvation of our Lord. In this way, Jesus, the Light of the World (John 8:12), will shine through us as lights to the world (Matthew 5:14). Through these seven mission priorities, we will form our ministry in the image of Christ, who came to earth to bring us salvation:

- 1. Plant, sustain, and revitalize Lutheran Churches through preaching, evangelism, and personal witness.
- 2. Support and Expand Theological Education to build up our current and future Church Workers, Pastors, and Lutheran School Teachers.
- 3. Perform Human Care in close proximity to Word and Sacrament ministry so that our good works always point people to Jesus.
- 4. Collaborate with Synod's members and partners to enhance mission effectiveness so that we can be united in our common mission.
- 5. Promote and nurture the spiritual, emotional, financial, and physical well-being of pastors and professional church workers so that they may be able to perform their work in the church to the best of their ability.
- 6. Enhance early childhood education, elementary and secondary education, and youth ministry to bring the Gospel to the children of our church and community.
- 7. Strengthen and support the Lutheran family in living out God's design through our God-given vocations in life.

You will hear many ideas and possibilities throughout this Epiphany season. Take some time this month to consider what passions and interests you have that may help us to carry out our Christian mission in our church and community, whether that may be in youth ministry, in education, in human care/mission work, or in other areas of our mission. If you are passionate about any of these areas, both what Peace is already doing and ways we can expand our witness in each of these areas, please reach out to me, Pastor Teeple, or to our Board of Directors. None of these mission priorities are individual efforts. They are things to be done by the Body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12). So, let us remain bold and faithful in our witness as Peace Lutheran Church. For we will not keep silent about the Gospel. We will not be quiet, for the sake of the people in our community.

MORTGAGE REDUCTION and 2025 BUDGET

Current Unpaid Balance- \$ 405,005.17

Anticipated Pledges paid in 2025- \$ 100,000.00

\$ Amt. needed to pay off loan- \$ 305,005.17



The response to the mortgage reduction has been strong at year's end. The unpaid loan balance has been reduced by over half since November (November 30 balance=\$872,730.63) By doing this, we have been able to save significantly on the loan's interest expense. Once we have converted the construction loan (6%) to a mortgage loan (6.625%), we will have a set monthly payment for the duration of the mortgage payoff.

Our pledges in 2025 are important to be paid along with the 2025 general operating fund donations. Because we passed a 2025 budget deficit(-\$73,740.18) last November, the Board of Directors is closely monitoring the revenue(offerings) intake as well as the monthly operating expenses, so as to meet those monthly obligations. The Board may have to adjust expenditures based on the monthly offerings.

The Board of Directors will keep you updated on our progress. If you have any questions, please contact a Board member. Thank you for your dedicated support of Peace's mission in our community. We have much to be thankful for here at Peace Lutheran Church.

Spiritual First Aid has just released its new "Spiritual First Aid Basics Mini-Course" which teaches the key principles and helping skills of their flagship Spiritual First Aid Certificate Course in a condensed version.

This course was designed to make it possible so that anyone wanting to make a difference in the lives of hurting people can do so by quickly gaining some essential mental health support skills. The self–paced online Mini–Course can be completed in just 1–2 hours and is designed for even the busiest schedules. Course topics include: How to walk with others who are hurting, how to recognize and respond to unmet BLESS Needs and trauma, what to say (and not to say) when supporting others, best practices for providing comfort and meeting basic needs, and tips for comforting those who are suffering.







MISSION STATEMENT


