## A Letter from Pastor Rudolph

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means!

How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. (Romans 6:1-4)

New life. It's a topic on my mind these days (for obvious reasons). First, Tirzah and I both want to thank everyone who has cared for us, encouraged us, and prayed for us throughout this past year, as we expect our own family's new life, and especially those who participated in the baby shower on the 22nd. We look forward to celebrating her new life with you soon!

For a child, there is a certain way that life looks prior to birth. Then, once the baby is born, there is new life. Yes, there was life before birth just as there is life after birth, but now it is new. There are so many differences between old and new life. The old was more vulnerable even than the new. The old life trusted the voice of a mother it could not see, yet the new life trusts a mother it can see. After a baby is born, it can continue to grow and develop in ways it couldn't before. The baby can learn to walk and talk, things it couldn't do before.

So it is with our new life in Christ. Our lives looked different before Christ intervened. We were conceived and born in sin. By nature, we have no faith or desire to associate with God. There is no bone in us that was not hostile to God. Yet, God chose to intervene and to bring us out of that old life and to give us new life. Through baptism, our second birth, we are transformed from being sinners to being sinners and saints. This can only happen, through Christ, for Christ is the inflection point between our old lives and our new lives.

Jesus is the one who took His old, perfect life, and gave it up so that we might have new life in Him. He chose to become man, a vulnerable baby both in the womb and out, for the purpose of giving His life to us. He was baptized and connects us to Himself through water and the Word, delivering His grace to babies (young and old) so they might know a new and better life of faith. In order to do this, though, He had to give up His life. He gave up His life on the cross, *Father, into your hands I commit my spirit (Luke 23:46)*, knowing that life would be given to us through our own baptism. Through God's command in and with the water, we sinners receive new life through the death of His own Son. We share in His death, His burial, and His resurrection, all in that one miraculous moment!

Now we walk as new people, seeking to live outwardly the truth that we have been given to us inwardly. Every action we do is meant to display the faith that lives in us through Christ's Spirit. But even when we fail to live up to this new life in us, we look back to our baptism where the promises of forgiveness, life, and salvation reassure us and comfort us. These promises point us back to Christ's death and resurrection, where our new life was bought and paid for. Yet these promises also point forward to the day when Christ comes back once and for all. On that day, we will receive new life once again. We will receive a new and better life which no longer sits in the shadow of death, but looks toward life eternal with our Lord.

#### A Note from the Business Administrator Mortgage update:

We are well into our third and final year of our Capital Campaign, so I thought an update might be beneficial. During this construction loan phase, we have been making interest-only payments (at a rate of 6%). We have also been allowed to make payments to lower our principal (thereby lowering our monthly interest payments). As of

right now, our principal is down to \$394,821.00, and our February interest payment was \$2017.79. We have until December, 2025 to convert the construction loan to a mortgage, at which time our monthly mortgage payment will be calculated.

This can be done through our website and can be set up as recurring or one-time contributions. You can also set it up to be taken from your checking account (as an ACH payment) or charged to a credit card.

some time outdoors. We would love to have you join us!





#### The Old Chancel Cross: The Shield of St. Andrew

The shield of St. Andrew is a powerful symbol of faith, sacrifice, and discipleship. Traditionally, it features a diagonal cross, known as the Cross of St. Andrew. This distinctive cross represents the manner in which St. Andrew, one of Jesus' twelve apostles, was martyred. According to tradition, he considered himself unworthy to be crucified in the same manner as Christ and was instead bound to an X-shaped cross.



The Cross of St. Andrew is also a sign of humility and unwavering faith in the face of persecution. As Jesus taught in Luke 9:23, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." St. Andrew's shield encourages believers to stand firm in their faith, even in times of trial, and to embrace the mission of spreading the love of Christ.

Through its design, the shield of St. Andrew serves as both a reminder of his faithful witness and an inspiration for all who seek to follow Jesus with courage and devotion.



out. Regardless, all of us who are intrigued by the the soil and growing plants are certainly ready. There are no better optimists than gardeners. When your hands get dirty in the soil, you just have to grow closer to your Creator.

And so we begin the thirteenth year of "Garden of Peace: The Growing Place." Again, the first portion of the name identifies who and what we are and the second why we exist, as we grow both physically and spiritually. This is a unique ministry of Peace Lutheran to help church and community members experience the joy of gardening and to share the fruits of the harvest with others. And so it is time once again to sign up for a plot. There is no fee or cost involved but note: if you request a plot, it is necessary that you make the commitment to maintain the assigned garden area throughout the entire growing season. What we need now is a list of all those who wish to have a garden plot for the season. Each plot is approximately 10' by 18'. If you wish to reserve an area, you need to sign up in one of two ways:

1) Use the sign-up sheet that is available at the Information Desk at the east entrance of the church or 2) contact Garden Mentor Don Luepke via email at <a href="mailto:donluepke@juno.com">donluepke@juno.com</a> and give your name, e-mail address, and telephone number and if you were a gardener last year indicate if you wish the same plot. We ask that this be done by

Sunday, April 6, so that we can develop our organizational plan.

We also want to be able to reach out to members of the lakes community and perhaps mentor them in establishing a garden and producing food and flowers for their homes. If you know of someone outside of our church family please let them know. It's a matter of mission and ministry. After all we are Peace Lutheran Church: "Friendly People -Growing in Christ, Called to Praise and Proclaim, Learn and Love, Care and Celebrate!"

# Springtime Treats

#### Loaded Hash Brown Breakfast Casserole

#### Ingredients

20 ounce package frozen diced or shredded hashbrowns 1 white or yellow onion diced

1 red bell pepper diced

1 pound ground pork sausage, or 8 ounces diced ham

4 ounces diced green chiles drained (optional)

10 large eggs

2 cups half and half

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon black pepper

2 cups shredded cheddar cheese

#### **Instructions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F and lightly grease a 9X13 pan.
- 2. Add frozen hash browns, onion, bell pepper, ham (or cooked sausage), and green chiles directly in the 9X13 pan and toss together.
- 3. In a large mixing bowl, whisk eggs. Pour in half and half and season with salt and pepper and whisk to combine. Stir in shredded cheese.
- 4. Pour egg mixture on top of hashbrown mixture in the prepared pan.
- 5. Cover the pan with aluminum foil and bake in the preheated oven for 45-60 minutes until eggs are set.

#### Strawberry Dump Cake

#### Ingredients

1 can (21 ounces) strawberry pie filling 1 cup strawberries, washed, sliced 1 box (15.25 ounces) white cake mix 3/4 cup (11/2 sticks) unsalted butter, cold

#### Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Spray a 9×9-inch baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.
- 2. To the baking dish, add the strawberry pie filling. Then, add the strawberries.
- 3. Sprinkle the cake mix evenly over the top.
- 4. Slice the butter into small pats (about 16). Place them evenly over the top of the cake mixture.
- 5. Bake for 45-50 minutes, or until the topping is golden brown and the pie filling is bubbling.
