

I love getting gifts that are unexpected. I do not like it when someone says "tell me what you want for Christmas and I will get it for you." For me, I like the surprise. I like opening something that I have no idea what it might be.

Because for me, it is not the gift that I am given. It is the time, I was being thought of, while they found the "perfect" gift to give me. I remember a specific Christmas, when my oldest son was four and a half years old. Unknown to me, while my son was visiting his grandma, my mother, she took him Christmas shopping. She told me later about the shopping expedition. She told my son he could get his mommy whatever he wanted for Christmas and grandma would wrap it up, hide it and he could give it to his momma on Christmas. He was very good with secrets, and still is to this day. My mom said he walked around the store for an hour, looking at all the options, till his eyes fell upon, what he believed was the PERFECT Gift. I remember the look on his little face on Christmas morning as I was surprised to get a package from him. And the pride in his eyes as I opened to find the most "unattractive, leopard print caftan." He proudly exclaimed "Mommy I picked it for you cause I know you like to be comfy and you like animals." See, it was not the gift that mattered, it was the feelings that my child had, giving me the gift. I proudly wore the unattractive gift for over a year till it finally went to shreds. Many times when I had it on, you could see the pride in his face that he picked it for me. I have to think that God finds that pleasure when we give of ourselves in his name. We may stumble when we try to present something at church, or we may not say a prayer as perfect as someone else, or the love offering may not be as big as someone else's. Our gifts may be unattractive to the human eye, but we give with the love of our soul. We give to the glory of our King, and I am sure it pleases him. 
