

Please continue or start saving aluminum cans of all sorts (pop. tea. fruit juices, health drinks. power drinks, beer and any other type of aluminum cans).


Drop them off at the ramp behind the church at any time. Thanks to the folks at Arc Manor for continuing to save their 200 drink cans and to be in Mission with us.

The secretary and treasurer's reports were read and approved.


- 1. Our recent fund raisers were a great success:
