


LENTEN BIBLE STUDY

MISSIONS AND MISSIONS UPDATES 2019 VBS ALUMINUM CANS

(First Church)

Our aluminum can collection for Habitat for Humanity continues.

In 1995 a project was started in First Church Vacation Bible School to teach our children about missions-helping other people. Collecting aluminum cans to raise money for Habitat for Humanity has been our VBS mission emphasis ever since.

In those 23 years, through June 22, 2018, we have collected 705,440 cans, giving \$11,996 to Habitat. After several years, our collection effort was expanded to all year long. Cans are dropped off at the ramp in the back of our church, are counted and sold.

Over the years several other churches, firehalls and community individuals have joined in.

We invite our sister churches to join in our aluminum can collection. I will supply a collection container for each church that is interested and pick up their cans monthly. If your church is interested, let me know 724-548-7124 or 724-859-0819.

(Manorville)


How many of you have pill bottles in your bathroom cabinet?




