Romans 8: 27 The Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I have an annoying habit. I sigh. I sigh when I am bored. I sigh when I am frustrated. I sigh when I am overwhelmed. I sigh when I have to do something I would rather not do. I've never counted but I would bet that I sigh many times throughout the course of the day.

Maybe that's why I love these verses from the book of Romans. I find great comfort in knowing that God knows what my sighs mean. God knows why I am frustrated. God knows why I am sad. God knows why I don't know which way to turn. God knows why I am sighing and more importantly God interprets that sigh and uses it to answer my unspoken prayers. Prayers that I did not even know I was making.

What confidence we can have knowing that because of the Holy Spirit those things for which we have no words, those circumstances that cause us deep wordless pain, those relationships that escape our understanding, have been placed before our great God who can handle them. Without even thinking about praying, we have an Advocate who hears our prayers made in the silence of our hearts. How utterly amazing and loving our God is!

Scientists at Stanford University have discovered that we all sigh about 12 times an hour. It is not just a reflex to stress, sadness or despair. Two tiny clusters of nerve cells in the brain stem automatically trigger our sighs. The study has discovered that the sigh is actually a life-sustaining reflex that preserves our lung function.

Funny how scientists have just discovered what we knew all along-that our sighs are very much life-sustaining. But you and I know that it has little to do with our lungs! Blessings.

Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God: and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not, knoweth not God; for God is Love.



#### Note: in order to qualify for the scholarship you must:


- 1.) Return the completed application in its entirety on time.


#### **New Business:**

Drop them off at the ramp behind the church at any time. Thanks to the folks at Arc Manor for continuing to save their 168 drink cans and to be in Mission with us.



## MAY MISSIONS FOCUS-UMCOR CLEANING BUCKETS

"Early In & Last Out"

(First Church)

During the last several months, many areas of our country have experienced devastation following floods, tornadoes & hurricanes AND the over whelming task of cleaning up. The need for UMCOR (United Methodist

Committee on Relief) cleaning buckets has become urgent. While UMCOR is not a first-response organization, it stands ready to assist communities in need over the long haul of their recovery until a "new normal" is established after a crisis. "Early in & last out" is a guiding principle of UMCOR.


