

The words of the Teacher, son of David, king in Jerusalem: "Meaningless! Meaningless!" says the Teacher. "Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless." Ecclesiastes 1: 1-2



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Lately I have been annoyed by a commercial for Nespresso. We see George Clooney taking care of coffee plants, planting, and watering. It is not so much what we see as what he is saying that annoys me. As he talks about the coffee, he uses phrases like, "growing new beginnings," "creating infinite possibilities," and "preserving the beauty of our world." Oh, for crying out loud! It's coffee!

Solomon, the greatest king of Israel, the wisest man to ever live, is struggling with the meaning of life. Throughout all of Ecclesiastes, he elucidates how everything in life is meaningless. This is the man who has riches beyond compare. He lives in a palace unlike any other. He can command thousands of servants to indulge his every desire. He has wives and children too numerous to count. He rules over all of Israel with a godly wisdom that is far above any other human. He is respected. His judgments are sought after. His enemies fear him. And yet, he finds everything in life to be meaningless.

Finally, at the end of chapter 12, Solomon discovers the one thing that gives life a purpose. "Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter: Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the duty of all mankind (vs. 13)." The only way to live a fruitful, joyful, purposeful life is to love God and follow God's ways.

As we continue to celebrate Jesus' resurrection, how true this conclusion of Solomon's is for our own lives. Because Jesus lives and reigns over all, we are free of sin and death. That freedom redefines why we live and how we live. We live with faithful gratitude for God's unmeasurable grace. We live with joyful love for one another and for all people everywhere. We move on behalf of others so that all will know the joy of life in the Holy Spirit.

With my apologies to all coffee drinkers out there, a cup of coffee, even if it is Nespresso, cannot create infinite possibilities or preserve the beauty of our world. Perhaps I might feel differently if George were talking about M&M's, but I would hope not.

Without Jesus, our lives are meaningless. Without Jesus, eternal new beginnings are not possible. Without Jesus, infinite possibilities are limited to our very finite, imperfect, world. Without Jesus, the beauty of relationships with God and with others is easily tarnished. Without Jesus, everything truly is meaningless.

In this season of resurrection, let us embrace the joy of being disciples of Jesus





ATTENTION ALL ARTISTS & PHOTOGRAPHERS


UNITED METHODIST WOMEN FUNDRAISER







A motion was made, seconded, and passed to give \$100.00 to Red Bird Mission.


Donna Shaffer will check with teachers in Armstrong School District to see if we can help support children in some way in our district.

Motion made to adjourn meeting and was approved.


