

"We don't see things clearly. We're squinting in a fog, peering through a mist." 1 Corinthians 13: 12

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I was in trouble. Our professor had just turned out the lights. Apparently, his classes consisted entirely of slide shows shown throughout the semester. It was my first Art Appreciation class, and it was a mistake. Looking for an easy elective, I chose this class. I should have known better. It was 8 AM on a Tuesday morning. With little sleep and no caffeine, staying awake was going to be a struggle, every Tuesday and Thursday morning for 12 long weeks.

I watched, bleary-eyed, as architecture, statuary, paintings, and art installations were flashed on the screen and his voice droned on. While I have retained little of this class, I discovered that I love impressionism. In particular, Monet's *Water Lilies Series*, speaks to me. The ponds and lilies are fuzzy around the edges and not well defined. I love their softness and gentleness.

The thirteenth chapter of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians is known as the love chapter. Famously read at weddings, it does not address romantic love. Instead, Paul is speaking about their lack of maturity when it comes to Christian love. Paul lists for the church the qualities of a mature love rooted in Jesus. Yet, Paul offers grace. He understands that we do not have the ability to see what God sees. He understands that the world as we see it is out of focus and without clear form. Because of this fogginess, our expression of love needs guidelines and definition.

But there is hope for us. Paul completes this verse by writing, "But it won't be long before the weather clears, and the sun shines bright! We'll see it all then, see it all as clearly as God sees us, knowing him directly just as he knows us." At the completion of time, God will reveal all things to us. We will see ourselves and God clearly. Love will be genuine and will not be clouded by our imperfections and immaturity.

Our journey through Lent is an opportunity for us to push back some of the fog that distorts our relationship with and our sight of God. As we pray, worship, study and repent, clarity will come, and we will know God more fully. In this way, God's love will become our way of living and our way of relating to God and to one another.

I do love the softness and gentleness of Monet's *Water Lilies Series*. I like the fact that you don't necessarily "see" the lilies more so you "feel" their impression. I guess there is a part of me that wishes all the world would be soft and gentle at the edges.

I am thankful, though, that God will clear up the fogginess that sometimes surrounds my ability to see God clearly and impedes my ability to love in the way of Jesus. As we make our way to the cross of Jesus, let us endeavor to allow our spiritual disciplines to push away the foggy edges of our understanding so that we may know God more fully, just as we are fully known. Let us learn to love in the way of Jesus.

As a lot of you know, I had major heart surgery at the end of September. Quadruple bypass was in store for me. I had some issues with small symptoms in late summer. I would get some chest pain if I was doing something and it was hot out. If I would stay and rest for a while the pain would go away. I went for a physical and told my Dr. at the VA about it; he said I don't like this, scheduled me for a Nuclear Stress Test at the VA in Pittsburgh. Something showed up; I went back two weeks later for a Cardiac Cath. Doctor did not like what he saw. They admitted me the same day, a Thursday, I had surgery on Monday.

When I was told about the surgery it felt like I got kicked in the gut by a mule. I knew they would take good care of me plus I had God in my corner. I had so many prayers and support from people coming my way. I thank everyone for their concern. God is good.

I have been recovering for four months now. Did three months of Cardiac Rehab at the Butler VA, was taken good care of again.

I went back to work at Sprankles two weeks ago delivering groceries one day a week. It is going very well.

God has a plan for all of us no matter what is in our lives. I thank God everyday for a new lease on life.



RAMPS OF HOPE RECEIVES GRANTS


The Ramps of Hope ministry of the UMC in Armstrong County is pleased to announce that we have received a Medical Staff grant from the Armstrong County Memorial Hospital Foundation in the amount of \$5500. Our team from the Allegheny River Charge has built 114 ramps since they began in October 2013. With all the work being done by volunteers, materials for ramps generally cost anywhere from \$200 to \$2000. Many recipients do not have the financial means to afford a ramp but most of them try to give a donation toward a ramp's cost. This grant will help us to ensure that everyone who needs and requests a ramp will get one.

In addition, the Ramps of Hope ministry of Indiana District has received a \$3735 grant from the UMC's Global Ministries Mission Support. This is a very competitive grant throughout the WPAUMC and we are pleased to have received an award. This will be used by ramps teams in all counties of Indiana District. With funding from both of these grants, our ministry will be better able to meet our mission of enhancing the lives of those with limited mobility by providing ramps at their homes. We also always welcome donations from community organizations and individuals who feel moved to support this ministry.




