



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As a student in homiletics class, we were required to preach 2 sermons that were videotaped. The sermons were preached in front of our classmates who would offer their opinions and then we would watch the tape with our professor who would offer his own critique. It was nerve wracking to say the least. I didn't mind the opinions of my peers since they were generally gracious and kind. They knew that it was a matter of time before their turn came.

However, watching myself with my professor was a different matter entirely. I was terrified. I am highly uncomfortable seeing myself on camera and knowing that my performance was being judged made it that much worse. I will never forget that experience. It was certainly traumatic.

John is explaining to the church that the primary way in which Christians are to be recognized is by love. We do not have to summon up love on our own. It is a product of God's first loving us and now living in us. As we mature in faith and knowledge and love of God, our love grows more perfect.

My meeting with my professor each time was another exercise in frayed nerves. However, he gently pointed out some glaring issues that needed to be corrected so that my effectiveness as a preacher would improve. There was a marked improvement in my second sermon presentation. Thankfully, when grades rolled around, my professor graded according to growth and improvement, not on some benchmark of perfection.

How wonderful then to know that our God of all righteousness, when we come to judgment day, will be looking for the growth of Jesus' love in us. We do not have to fear standing before the throne for we will have lived the love of Jesus in all that we say and do. The scripture says, "...our love **grows** more perfect," it is not expected to be perfect in every way, all the time. How good is our God?! Let us continue then, to grow in love and to grow in living that love like Jesus, so that on judgment day we will have nothing to fear.



MISSIONS FOCUS FOR MAY—RAMPS OF HOPE

What a life changing blessing RAMPS OF HOPE is for people and their families. Built specifically to fit their home, these wooden blessings bring mobility and accessibiblity...two magnificent blesings that most of us take for granted.

In 2020, our diligent team built 22 ramps. So far in 2021, 3 ramps have been built and 5 more are waiting for the completion of paper work.

This year our team is facing exceedingly high supply costs. Check these

costs out: In 2020, a 2"x6"x12' cost \$9.69. today it is \$18.29

In 2020, a 4"x4"x10' post was \$13.09. Today it is \$25.09

In 2020, a box of 125 lag bolts was \$40.99. today it is \$53.68

Dear friends, we ask for your loving generous help in contributing money for the necessary lumber and lag bolts that ramps require. May God deeply bless the families that receive these blessings. May God deeply strengthen and bless our dedicated ramp team.
