

Bless the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! He has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing that comes from heaven. Ephesians 1:3

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I still like looking for hidden objects. If only they had a Highlights for adults, I would subscribe. Yet I am grateful, that with careful looking and humble searching, I will find the priceless spiritual blessings from God throughout my life.


Rediscover the gift of Advent that comes without packages, ribbons, and bows.


