

2 Peter 1: 13 CEB

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Aequorea victoria. Can't pronounce it? Neither can I. It is a fancy Latin name for a species of jellyfish that glows in the dark. I find that fascinating. Don't get me wrong, I find jellyfish to be weird because of their ghostly appearance, their squishiness, and their passive way of life. They can't swim. They are at the mercy of the ocean currents to move them from one place to another. What good are they? So why in heaven's name, did God think we needed a glow in the dark version?

The Lord has revealed to Peter that he will die soon. In the time he has left, he writes to the church to remind them that the Lord has given them everything they need to live godly lives. He encourages them to develop their faith through the practice of moral excellence, knowledge, self-control, endurance, godliness, and love for others. When they do these things, they will receive a rich welcome into God's kingdom.

The season of Lent lends itself to self-examination, to take stock of how we are living our faith in Jesus. Are we learning all we can about our Lord and Savior? How are we doing at developing our self-control when it comes to temptation? How enduring will our faith be in times of trouble? Are we living lives of moral excellence and godliness before others? Are we truly loving the unlovable?

We examine our faith lives in an effort to course correct our path where we see ourselves veering off the course that Jesus has laid out for us. Peter is well aware that we quickly forget that we are called to grow in faith so that we will glory to God and be a witness to Jesus for the world.

It turns out that these glow in the dark jellyfish produce a protein called apoaequorin (yep, can't pronounce that either.) Chemists have produced a lab-made version of this protein that is thought to aid in reversing memory loss and is found in over-the-counter memory enhancing supplements. I guess God had a plan for this strange glowing creature after all.

But if it's all the same to you, I'd rather let Peter stir up our memory and remind us that we are to never stop growing in faith. We are to constantly grow in moral excellence, knowledge, self-control, endurance, godliness, and love for others. This is our calling in Jesus. The jellyfish can just stay in the ocean!

Top of the day to ya! The most fun thing about March, other than my Birthday, is Saint Patrick's Day! Just having a little fun, wearing the green and eating pistachio muffins, they are green, that's my excuse, mmm. But, despite all the Leprechaun talk and stories of pots of gold, there lies a rich story about a man devoted to God who spread the Gospel

throughout Ireland. Patrick was born in Britain, at the time, of the Roman Empire (of which Britain was a part), which was on the verge of collapse. Barbarians were invading different regions of the empire. Roman legions (large groups of soldiers) had deserted Britain, making it vulnerable to attack. When Patrick was sixteen years old, Irish pirates invaded his village, destroyed it and took Patrick captive. He was put on a ship bound for Ireland. In Ireland, Patrick was sold as a slave and put to work as a shepherd for pigs. Life was hard for Patrick. He was exposed to a harsh climate and nearly starved to death. He was completely alone, but he turned to God for comfort and companionship. After having visions that directed him to leave Ireland and return to Britain, study ministry and become, ordained as a bishop. Patrick returned to Ireland to start sharing the Gospel about Jesus with the Irish people. Patrick's missionary work over the next thirty years was truly remarkable, spreading the gospel, baptizing and confirming countless believers and founding many churches and monasteries. Spreading the Gospel in Ireland was far from easy for Patrick. He faced frequent opposition and was in constant danger of being killed for his bold faith. Lorica, also known as "Patrick's Breastplate," is a special prayer of protection that Patrick would say. Many people read it today because it reminds them of Patrick's confidence in the Lord. Begin an Irish tradition, Google "Patrick's Breastplate" and read it. Knowing that he put his life on the line to serve the Lord. Praise God we are blest to serve our Lord without fear of death.



What you need:
1 package yeast
1 1/2 cups warm water
1 tablespoon sugar
1 tablespoon salt
4 cups flour
1 egg



Mix your yeast, water, sugar, and salt in a large bowl. Stir in the flour, and knead until the dough is smooth. Shape into the form of arms crossed in prayer and place it on a baking sheet. Brush the dough with a beaten egg to give it a shiny finish. Sprinkle the top with salt, and bake in an oven preheated to 425 degrees for 15 minutes.

The Legend of the Pretzel

In the Early centuries of the Church, Christians would fast on bread and water during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

Around the year 610, a creative young monk decided to make a treat for the children who had learned to recite their prayers.

Christians in those days prayed by folding their hands across their chests with each hand touching the opposite shoulder. The monk rolled his Lenten dough of water, flour and salt into the shape of two arms crossed in prayer. He named his bread pretiola, which in Latin means "little reward"; some stories say he named the bread bracellae, "little arms". German Christians called the bread bretzels, which over time became known as pretzels! The simple shape of the pretzel, reminds us to pray everyday.
