Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

My grandmother lived with our family for many years. She split her time between my aunt and my mother. When she was at our home, she had a bed in the room that I shared with her. We talked a lot before drifting off to sleep. There were many nights when she would tell me of the dream she had a couple of times a week. She would dream of leaving the house without her shoes on.

Those who interpret dreams would say that my grandmother suffered from a lack of confidence, and they would be right. She never graduated from high school. Her only jobs were cleaning others' homes after she lost her husband at an early age. She grew up poor and her adult life was meager as well. In her more mature years, she was dependent on her adult daughters to house her and care for her.


The people of the Hebrew church are suffering persecution and it is wearing down their commitment to faith in Jesus. Life would be so much easier if they gave into the world around them. So much of what Jesus taught is hard to put into practice in a world that is hostile to them. The author of Hebrews is concerned that this faith community will fall apart. He writes to encourage their faith and to warn them about falling away from Jesus. They have nothing to fear when Jesus is their helper and Savior. They can have confidence in their future when they rely on Jesus.

Our world seems to be a scary place these days and finding courage to face our challenges seems to be eluding us. But we have nothing to fear, for the Lord is our helper! We can move forward because our Lord is powerful and merciful and loving. We have confidence in Jesus to guide our steps and order our path and to walk with us wherever we go.

My grandmother was able to rent her own apartment the last few years of her life. She grew in confidence, making new friends and having the time of her life. She no longer mentioned her dream. She no longer left the house without her shoes.

Church, let's put on our shoes together and move out of God's house and into the world. We can do so, not because of our own strength, but because the Lord is our helper. We have nothing and no one to fear and we have a message to share. We have a message of the grace and love of Jesus to give.



Meeting closed with the reading of the UMW Prayer.




